Biography



Dr. Deborah Brandt is an affiliate faculty member at the Coady International Institute at Saint Francis Xavier University and was appointed the first Social Justice Chair in 2012. As a professor emeritus in the Faculty of Environmental Studies at York University in Toronto she founded and coordinated the Community Arts Practice program and taught popular education, community arts, and local and global food movements.

Dr. Barndt is a prolific researcher, authoring numerous texts, most notably To Change This House: Popular Education under the Sandinistas and Tangled Routes: Women, Work and Globalization on the Tomato Trail.

She also is a regular editor for VIVA! Community Arts and Popular Education in the Americas and Wild Fire: Art as Activism.

Dr. Barndt has strived for four decades to integrate her artist, activist, and academic selves. From involvement as a popular educator in social movements in Latin America, the U.S., and Canada, to teaching in Canadian universities, her work has been informed by a praxis orientation, critical feminist and Indigenous methodologies and diverse ways of knowing.
